


We have met the bully, and it is us.

Life on Earth depends upon life in the ocean.


In this touching poem, a coalition of sea creatures are asking for our help.




Sarah Borg worked quietly in the background on some of the most successful Sea Shepherd campaigns in the 1980s. She organized our ship the Sea Shepherd II for departure from the United Kingdom for campaigns to protect pilot whales and dolphins in the Faroe Islands. In 1986, she was the liaison between me and our crew in Iceland when we sank half the Icelandic whaling fleet and shut down illegal Icelandic whaling operations for seventeen years.

An activist for the ocean and an artist and a poet, Sarah's passion for defending life and diversity in the sea has been wonderfully expressed in her paintings and words. *Commotion in the Ocean* is a message to humanity that we are facing extraordinary threats to the survival of tens of thousands of species in the sea, and that the one thing each of us can do to halt these threats is to stop eating them.

The depletion of fish, whales, turtles, and seabirds is a direct cause for the decrease of 40 percent of the ocean's phytoplankton since 1950. Phytoplankton produces up to 70 percent of the oxygen in the air we breathe and removes enormous amounts of carbon dioxide. The diversity of life in the sea provides the essential elements for phytoplankton survival: iron, nitrogen, and magnesium. The animals of the sea literally fertilize the plants of the sea, which provide us with something far more essential than fish with our chips.

The diversity and interdependence of all life in the ocean is the foundation of our existence and makes it possible for humanity to exist. If the ocean dies, we all die! In this poem, Sarah points out that we have met the bully, and it is us.

There's a monster above,
a giant metal bully,
that hoovers the oceans

"Now let us be clear."


He looked down his nose.

They gathered their friends and swam to the islands, where small fishing boats were tied up to tall pylons.


The people complained, "There's no fish in the sea!"

And the dolphins and whales said, "Yes, we agree!"





"The oceans are bare,"

These ships intervene to stop cruelty and greed.


Now who are the people that make up the crew?


They're kind individuals, like me and like you,





