Every spring, Jewish families celebrate Passover.

At the seder meal, everyone gets a Haggadah, a book that retells the Passover story. Long ago, the Israelites were slaves in Egypt. They were led to freedom by a prophet named Moses. When Moses was just a baby, the daughter of the pharaoh, Egypt's ruler, found him floating in a basket on the Nile River and brought him to be raised in her father's court. As a young man, Moses intervened when he saw an Egyptian hurting an Israelite. Moses killed the Egyptian and fled the pharaoh's court. Because God was angry that the pharaoh refused to set the Israelites free, God sent the Angel of Death to Egyptian families. God warned the Israelites to mark their door-posts so the Angel of Death would pass over their homes. The pharaoh told the Israelites that they had to leave Egypt immediately. There was no time for baking bread, so they brought matzo with them. For most small children, hunting for a piece of matzo, called the afikomen, is the highlight of the Passover seder. The child who finds the afikomen gets a prize, usually candy or money.
