Coco Apunnguaq Lynge


Kuluk spots one big bowhead whale.

Altogether there are five, singing a tune.






At sea, a huddle of walruses is floating.

so she can count all eight.






A hole in the ice reveals a bob of seals.

An ulu is just out of reach.


Because of the ice they cannot breach.



Pod	A <i>pod</i> is a group of marine mammals, incluorcas, belugas, and other whales.	
Herd	A <i>herd</i> is a group of animals including mus and caribou.	
Huddle	A <i>huddle</i> is a group of walruses, and can alused to describe a group of penguins.	
Blessing	A <i>blessing</i> is a group of narwhals. It's also describe a group of unicorns!	
Bob	A <i>bob</i> is a group of seals. This can also be called a <i>colony</i> or a <i>rookery</i> .	
Pack	A <i>pack</i> is a group of wolves, and can also mean a group of dogs.	

This book uses an Inuktitut word. Capital letters show where the emphasis for the word should be.

Inuktitut word	Pronunciation	Definition
ulu	00-lu	a crescent knife traditionally used by women
