

They had spent many happy days of summer vacation trying new flavors and enjoying old favorites, like lemon meringue for listening to engines


and blueberry crisp for watching waves roll in.

Granddad chose his peaceful spot. Noor cut two slices of pie and snuggled in next to him as she began to read aloud.




They read more the next day.
